

Stewardship Sunday - 2022



Cardinal Thomas Collins' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship is organized into four sections.

- Section One: The Meaning of Stewardship This section explores the reality that we are
 invited by God to be good stewards of His
 gifts. "If we truly have the spirit of
 stewardship, we will not let God's gifts go to
 waste, and we will not selfishly cling to them,
 but use them graciously to serve others, and
 in doing so give glory to God."
- Section Two: The Spirituality of Deep Stewardship This section explores the concept that deep stewardship is not fundraising. "We can only be satisfied with deep stewardship, which means a profound inner conversion as individuals and as a community in which we become committed to living generously in every way, as the Gospel calls us to do."
- Section Three: Reasons to **Become** Involved in Stewardship - The reasons being: it is Biblical, fruitful, realistic. comprehensive, continuous, proactive and it addresses the engagement dilemma. "Stewardship calls for nothing less than both individual and communal conversion, rooted in faith and fruitful in action."
- Section Four: The Way Forward To continue to develop vibrant parishes, it is key that we try to increase active engagement. "It is a lively faith family that challenges us as disciples to do great things for Jesus, in the spirit of the Acts of the Apostles."

World Day of Migrants and Refugees September 25, 2022

The theme announced by His Holiness Pope Francis for the 108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is "Building the Future with Migrants and Refugees." In his message, Pope Francis reminds us that inclusion of those most vulnerable is the necessary condition for full citizenship in God's Kingdom. Indeed, the Lord says, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me" (Mt 25:34-36).

Volunteer Screening

All "individuals" who volunteer for an Archdiocese Toronto parish must be authorized by the Parish Pastor, be part of a parish ministry, serve under a parish ministry leader, have a parish volunteer file. Must complete the mandatory code of conduct, and a mandatory police clearance through Sterling Talent Solutions for positions of Trust/high risk ministries as well as General risk. YOU DO NOT GO THROUGH ORILLIA POLICE DEPARTMENT.

Everyone must have new police report every 5 years.

Lay associations such as Knights of Columbus, Catholic Women's League, Legion of Mary, St. Vincent De Paul are not parish ministries but are separate entities that have and are responsible for their own Leadership, members, volunteers, insurance, screening. But exception to rule if you are volunteering as in taking up collection, on altar, volunteering counting money, key holder or with young people this is separate from your ministry. Must be screened with Alice Murphy or Pauline Stewart at Guardian Angels Church. We hope to have all 5 churches have a screener.

All files at Guardian Angels will be checked and you will receive an e-mail or telephone call to see if you may have to do another screening.

Volunteer screening is one of the most important ministries in our churches.
